Dual Diagnosis Residential Treatment Program

Since 1971, serving adults with serious psychiatric disorder and a history of substance abuse disorders, coming from directly from acute psychiatric facilities or after recent discharge, while still at high risk of hospitalizations. Providing 24 hour support services and day treatment support.

Supported Independent Living Program (SIL)

Offers rehabilitation services to adults who are dually diagnosed through 3 distinct program components: **Case Management:** specialized support services tailored individual needs, **Transitional Satellite Housing:** clean and sober housing, recovery, and support services in small, residence homes, **Permanent Housing:** long-term clean and sober single unit apartments for adults who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. All aspects provide counseling, independent living skills training, and help in accessing community service are provided.

Wellness Centers (Casa Ubuntu and BWC)

Day socialization program serving adults who are mentally disabled. Provides art classes, support groups, counseling, pre-vocational training and placements, and regular outings to Bay Area cultural and recreational spots. A friendly atmosphere is created by staff, volunteers, and members of the wellness centers.

Integrated Service Teams (IST)

BHI staff participates in multi-agency teams providing support services to formerly homeless, disable tenants in permanent housing through Alameda County.

Bridges to Recovery In-home Outreach Team (IHOT)

A community outreach program consisting of Peer specialist, Family Coach, Personal Service Coordinator, and a Mental Health Lead. Supporting to connect referred community member with mental health services, housing, food, substance use services, transportation, clothing, or medical care. IHOT also honors the collaborative efforts of family members and loved ones.

CalWORKS (Phoenix S.K.I.L.L.S)

Mental health services are a national mandate for Welfare to Work recipients who have mental health barriers which prevent them from acquiring competitive work on their own. Aimed to address limited treatment engagement: 60% of mental health referrals from SSA do not translate to BHCS episode openings; competing care-taking demands (e.g., difficulty in finding childcare, sick or disabled children or family members); Misaligned treatment duration limits: consumers can be discharged mid-treatment cycle due to their WTW eligibility status; and The difficulty of securing employment with a salary adequate to support economic self-sufficiency for a family within the Bay Area.

Community Assessment & Transport Teams (CATT)

Supporting the community crisis response system that is efficient and effective to connect community members to the most supportive services, without the unnecessary use of first responder and client time. CATT combines unique crisis transport model to include a mental health provider and an emergency medical technician. With a goal of collaborative approach to increase emergency system response, and decrease hospitalizations.
